About Ripon Sailing Club

Ripon Sailing Club was formed by a group of enthusiasts from the Ripon area in 1957, sailing initially on the river Ure at Langthorpe, Nr Boroughbridge. The intention of these early members was that it should be a "Family Club" with good fellowship as well as good sailing. This is still the aim today, and the number of youngsters and families sailing at Farnham is testimony to that.

Ripon Sailing Club moved to Farnham Lake in 1972 after a few years sailing on the South Lake the club moved to the then 20-acre North Lake where they have been ever since.

The area of water is now nearly 75-acres and is leased from a local property trust. The club owns the freehold of the land and built the present club house during the winter of 1985/86. It was officially opened in August 1986 by Dr Bill Jones, a former Commodore and long standing member.

Club Facilities

The clubhouse provides Changing and Shower facilities plus a large clubroom & lounge with Galley and Bar.

The galley will be open throughout the day, providing a range of meals and snacks, ranging from breakfast butties through lunch to cakes for afternoon tea.

Camping

Behind the clubhouse is a field which will provide ample space for those who wish to pitch tents or motorhomes on site on Friday or Saturday nights. Those wishing to camp on Friday night are asked to give prior notice so that we can make arrangements for access to the club grounds.

Access will be made available to the shower and toilet facilities overnight for those camping on the site. The clubhouse is NOT available as a bunkroom.

Location

The club's sailing water is **Farnham Lake** which is to the North of Knaresborough in North Yorkshire, just about 5 miles from the A1. A map appears further on in this pack.

Racing

Racing will take the form of 3 races with 2 to count. The first race will be at 11am, with a briefing at 10.30am.

In order to allow sailors to pack up and leave at their own pace it is intended that the prizegiving will be held 30 minutes after the last boat finishes in the final race.


Crews


After Sailing Supper and Social


