WELCOME

Solway Yacht Club invites you to join us for a weekend of wonderful sailing in a great environment and in a setting of outstanding natural beauty. The weekend consists on Saturday of the Lakeland and Border Grand Prix for the Lasers, with both days being Round 7 of the National 12 Dinghy Shack Series together with a round of the Norther series, as well as an Open Meeting for Fast and Medium Handicap Classes. Note that any Laser sailors staying for the Sunday will sail as part of the Medium Handicap fleet that day and have their elapsed times on the Saturday counting in the Handicap results that day also, as it is intended that both fleets, if not starting together, will sail the same course, albeit starting at slightly different times. Boats with a PY handicap of 1209 or greater will be very welcome to participate in Coached Racing which will be run concurrently, aimed at younger sailors, for which entry will be free and no prizes will be awarded.

Unless a class fleet is large enough to justify a separate start (see below), the Lasers and National 12 classes will race in the Medium Handicap fleet and have their results extracted to produce class results.

The sailing area (see chart below) is a wonderful scenic estuary entering the Solway Firth. Racing for dinghies takes place in the more sheltered area stretching from where the river begins to open out to the fringes of the Solway Firth. The estuary gives competitors the exciting experience of sea sailing but in an area sheltered from the strongest winds. Tides and currents add to the mix. The large and comfortable clubhouse is in an elevated position with views over to Glen Isle. The Club site has a large boat park and offers excellent launching from pontoons and a large slipway. Because of the tides, timings are crucial and racing is run to a tight schedule.

ACCOMMODATION & PARKING

There are many hotels and boarding houses within easy walking or motoring distance as well as caravan, camping and holiday chalets nearby, but early reservations are advised.

There is limited car parking space at the club site and the public car park. However, please respect local businesses' interests. For the safety of competitors and spectators, vehicles may not be driven onto the pier area and boat park other than to drop off or collect boats.

CATERING & BAR

It is hoped to hold a social event with supper and have the bar open on the Saturday evening. Booking for this will be by Webcollect, accessible from the SYC website closer to the time.

HOW TO FIND US



Kippford lies to the south of Dalbeattie along the A710. From the west, follow the A745 and then the A711 from

Castle Douglas to the boundary of Dalbeattie. From the north or east, follow the A711 from Dumfries until the traffic lights at the far end of Dalbeattie. For both, now take the A710, which is signposted "Solway Coast". Follow this road for around 3 miles and then turn right at a sign for Kippford. The clubhouse entrance roadway is just before the entrance to a public car park at the foot of the hill on the left and the boat park is on the right just round a sharp left-hand corner.

CONDITIONS

1. The meeting will be open to all Lasers as per the Lakeland and Border Grand Prix protocols. For the National 12s all boats meeting their class association rules are eligible to enter. The Fast and Medium Handicaps will be open to boats with a class certificate and a PY Number below and including 1208 with the split decided once entries have been received. The Laser and N12 fleets will be given separate starts if they have 10 or more entries. Otherwise, at the discretion of the Race Officer they may be asked to start with the Medium Handicap Class fleet. Lasers and National 12s will also be eligible for prizes in the Medium Handicap fleet, assuming that they have sailed the same length of course. Flying Fifteens will be eligible to sail in the Fast Handicap fleet.

- 2. The racing will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) 2021 2024, the event Sailing Instructions and the relevant class association rules. The Advisory Hearing and RYA Arbitration of the RYA Rules Disputes procedures shall apply (for information on the procedures, go to www.rya.org.uk/go/rules). The outcome of an RYA Arbitration can be referred to a protest committee, but an arbitration cannot be reopened or appealed.
- 3. The entrant will be deemed to be the helmsman named on the entry form.
- 2. Changes of boat must be notified in writing and will require the approval of the Principal Race Officer and Club Sailing Secretary prior to commencement of the series.
- 3. During the series the crew may be swapped if notified in writing and with approval of the Principal Race Officer prior to commencement of the race. Helms as indicated on the entry must always be part of the boat's crew.
- 4. Personal buoyancy must be worn by all competitors. Boat buoyancy may be subject to scrutiny. A suitable painter or tow rope of at least 5 metres must be carried on all boats to facilitate towing and rescue.
- 5. For the National 12s, the results will be calculated using the PY numbers allocated by the N12 Class Association for different boat categories. Flying Fifteens will use their Gold, Silver or Classic PYs.
- 6. Depending on the size of the entry, a tally system will probably be used to ensure all competitors return safely after racing. If used, all competitors are obliged to use it and to cooperate fully with its requirements.
- 7. Visitors and competitors are asked to respect the local amenities and residents during their stay at Kippford. Dogs should be kept on a leash at all times on the Club premises and pier.
- 8. Car numbers should be kept to a minimum and should be parked in club or public car parks and are not allowed onto the boat park once the series has started other than to deliver and collect competing boats.
- 9. All entries must be made via Webcollect (link from the Club website). The Medical and Consent form must be completed online. In addition, where the competitor (helm or crew) is under 18, a paper copy must be completed, signed by the parent or guardian and delivered to the Club Race Office prior to the Briefing on the Saturday.

Anyone having difficulty using Webcollect may post a paper copy of the entry form (see below after Sailing Area) to John Broadbent, Bendouran, Colvend, Dalbeaatiie. DG5 4QD, with a cheque entry fee, **posted 1**st **Class by Thursday 1**st **September** so the latter can complete the Webcollect entry on their behalf by the entry deadline date.

10. Any alterations to these conditions or other details of this entry form shall be at the sole discretion of the Commodore and Race Committee of Solway Yacht Club.

Sailors should be aware that it can take some time to reach the racing area, so should be prepared to launch promptly after the Briefing. Please ensure boats are launched in sufficient time. In the event of light winds, tows may be available to help competitors reach the staring area, hence the need for carrying suitable tow ropes/painters.

Subsequent races in a day will start as soon as practicable after the end of the previous race.

It is hoped to run 3 races on the Saturday and 2 on the Sunday, but conditions may not make this possible. If a Committee Boat is used that can easily change station, it is hoped that the first start and last finish will be close to the Starting Hut but other starts and finishes will be in the vicinity of Rough Island or beyond.

PRIZES

At the discretion of SYC and dependent on numbers, prizes may be awarded to the leading boats in each fleet. There are sponsored Dinghy Shack prizes for the N12s including separate awards for foiling, non-foiling and vintage entries.

ENTRY DEADLINE AND FEES

As already mentioned in Condition 9 above, all entries must be made via Webcollect by 2000 on Friday 9th September using the Link: https://webcollect.org.uk/syc and fees paid via Paypal or Bank Transfer, or by cash or cheque (payable to Solway Yacht Club) at the Briefing which will be at 1000 on Saturday 10th September.

Online copies of the SIs will be available via the SYC Website before the event.


Printed SIs and Course Cards will be made available at the Briefing.
